



Deloris M. Wiese

May 1, 1925 - March 19, 2018

OSMOND — Funeral service for Deloris M. Wiese, 92, of Norfolk formerly of McLean, will be held at 1:00 p.m., Saturday, March 24, 2018 at the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Osmond with Rev. Glen Emery officiating. Interment will be at the Rose Hill Cemetery, rural McLean. Visitation will be 4:00-7:00 p.m., Friday also at the church in Osmond.

Deloris died Monday, March 19, 2018 at the St. Joseph's Rehabilitation and Care Center in Norfolk. Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Osmond is in charge of the arrangements.

Deloris M. Wiese was born on May 1, 1925 at the home of my parents Fredrick and Gesine (Stolle) Schlake, of McLean, NE. The farm place was located four miles east of Osmond. She was baptized at the Hope Lutheran Church in June of 1925 by Reverend Franzen. Hope Lutheran Church was located three miles south of McLean, now known as Rose Hill Cemetery. Her sponsors were her grandparents Henry and Hermine Schlake Albers. She was confirmed in May of 1939 at the Hope Lutheran Church by Reverend Harold Hoff. Deloris attended school all eight grades at District 19 E, and graduated from Osmond High School in 1943. She then went on to graduate from Wayne State College. She taught school for three years; one year at country school Dist. 62 North of Osmond, one year at country school Dist. 46 near Pierce, and one year at Hartington Public School teaching first grade. She married Delhart Wilferd Wiese on July 6, 1947 at St. John's Lutheran Church in Randolph by Reverend Harold E. Hoff. After marriage they moved to the farm four miles North of Osmond where they joined Immanuel Lutheran Church in Osmond.

She was a member of the Lutheran Ladies Aid, a voting member of Immanuel Lutheran Church, a member of the Sunny Dale Club, and was secretary for the National Farmers Organization County and District. She worked for two years as a cook for Osmond Public Schools, and also worked part time for the Osmond Veterinary Clinic since 1977. Since 1972, Deloris made the baptismal clothes as a gift for all the babies baptized at Immanuel Lutheran Church in memory of her husband Delhart. And in 1973 she started making corsages every year for the Host and Hostess also in memory of her husband. Some hobbies that Delores enjoyed were baking and decorating cakes for all occasions, making silk flowers and flowers from wood fiber and crepe paper, knitting baby blankets for each grandchild and afghan's for each member of the family. She enjoyed painting landscapes,

craft items, and mail boxes for family and friends. She also loved crocheting, reading, and watching movies on video tapes. Most of all, Deloris loved to visit and share her love for life.

They had six children: Linda Wecker of Verdigre, Elton Wiese of Spring Creek, Nev., Elaine (Doug) Levos of McLean, Lowell (Brenda) Wiese of Randolph, Nadene Chavet of Plainview and Nyla (Pat) Wolff of Norfolk. She also is survived by 18 grandchildren, 23 great-grandchildren; a brother, Marvin Schlake of McLean; and nieces and nephews. She was a school teacher, as well as a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Osmond, the Lutheran Ladies Aid, National Farmers Organization and the Sunny Dale Club.

She was preceded in death by her spouse, Delhart Wiese; her parents, Fred and Gesine Schlake; a sister-in-law, LaVerne Schlake; a son-in-law, Ron Wecker; and a great-granddaughter, Brianna Poppe.
