



Shirley Zechmann

October 18, 1930 - February 6, 2019

NORFOLK -- Funeral service for Shirley Zechmann, 88, of Norfolk will be held at 10:30 a.m., Wednesday, February 13, 2019 at the Trinity Lutheran Church in Foster with Rev. Jerome P. Leckband officiating. Interment will be in the Pleasant View Cemetery, Plainview. Visitation will be held 4:00-7:00, Tuesday at the Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Norfolk. Shirley passed away on Wednesday, February 6, 2019 surrounded by her loving family at the Bryan Hospital in Lincoln. Stonacek Funeral Chapel is in charge of the arrangements.

Shirley received life from her heavenly father October 18, 1930, on a farm near Creighton, Nebraska. Her parents were William and Erna (Huth) Hilkemeier. On November 23, 1930, she received the gift of Holy Baptism at Immanuel Lutheran Church of Plainview, Nebraska. On December 16, 1940, Shirley was confirmed at the Stark Valley Lutheran Church where she publicly confessed her faith. She grew up on farms near Creighton and Plainview, Nebraska. She attended school at District 23 and later attended Foster High School. In 1987, at the age of 57, she worked hard and received her GED at Northeast Community College in Norfolk, Nebraska. Shirley and her sisters helped their dad farm and milk cows because they didn't have any brothers. She met Victor "Vic" while picking corn! On March 28, 1948, Shirley and Vic were united in marriage at the Lutheran church in Plainview. They were blessed with five children and 65 years of marriage. The blizzard of 1948-49 struck during their first year of marriage. They were snowed in for weeks at a time with 20 foot drifts! Shirley kept a daily diary since 1947. As a farm wife, she helped with the field work and milking cows. Shirley also loved gardening, cooking and baking. She was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church of Foster for many years. She was also a member of Ladies Aid, taught Sunday school and Bible School, and sang in the choir. She loved her Lord and Savior deeply. Vic and Shirley left the farm and moved to Norfolk, Nebraska in 2010. Survivors include three sons, Dick (Patti) Zechmann of Lincoln, Steve (Kristi) Zechmann of Lincoln, Bill (Lorraine) Zechmann of Overland Park, Kansas, a daughter Pam Walton of Norfolk, fifteen grandchildren, and many great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, her son Don, her sisters Arlene, Beverly, and Jeanette, and her daughter-in-law Jane.
