He then moved to Colorado Springs in 1998 where he was a maintenance and groundskeeper at an apartment complex. Todd moved back to Nebraska in 2008. Todd enjoyed the great outdoors, fishing, hunting and listening to heavy metal/rock music.

Survivors include his mother, Sharon Zautke of Norfolk; sister Jennifer (Jeremy) Vaughan of Norfolk; nieces and a nephew; and great-nieces and a -nephew.
