PLAINVIEW — Services for Dale Beltz, 57, of Plainview will be Monday at 10:30 a.m. at Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Norfolk. Scott Krohn will officiate. Dale Beltz was born on June 27, 1959, in Plainview to Delmar Beltz and Arlene (Lambrecht) Beltz. He earned his Eagle Scout badge while a member of Boy Scout Troop 162. He graduated from Plainview high school in 1977 and served in the army from March 15, 1978, to March 10, 1981. He was a marksman with the 45 Caliber pistol. Dale also served in the Army National Guard from 1981 to 1987. He worked on the farm where he milked cows. He also worked for 17 years at Great Dane Trailer in Wayne. He retired due to health reasons. Dale enjoyed fishing, hunting and socializing with people. He played fast pitch softball over the years for Keystone, Mac Lounge and Pierce Heines. Dale also enjoyed throwing darts for league and competition.

Survivors include special friends Cathy Schutz and Jake Moua, both of Plainview; his brother, Ronald Keller of Norfolk; sister Donna (Doug) Eiting of Seward; sister-in-law Tammy Beltz of Struthers, Ohio; nephew James (Jackie) Beltz of St. Cloud, Minn.; Amber Beltz and fiancé David Peterson of Plymouth, Minn; nephews Cody Keller of Norfolk, Brook Keller of Norfolk, John Eiting of
