NORFOLK — Services for David E. Domina, 67, Norfolk, will be at 10:30 a.m. Friday, July 15, 2016 at Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Norfolk. Jim Hopkins will officiate with burial in Hillcrest Memorial Park Cemetery in Norfolk. Military rites will be conducted by the U.S. Navy Honors Guard, American Legion Post 16, Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 1644 and the Nebraska American Legion Riders. Visitation will be 4-7 p.m. Thursday at Stonacek Funeral Chapel. He died Monday, July 11, 2016, at Golden Living Center in Norfolk.

Born Aug. 7, 1948, at Onawa, Iowa, the son of Clifton and Lois (Wagner) Domina lived various places throughout his childhood until his family settled in Harlan in 1963. He graduated from Harlan High School in 1967 and then attended Nebraska Christian College for a year. After college, David served in the U.S. Navy on the U.S. Camden off the coast of Vietnam for four years from Feb. 11, 1969, to Jan. 15, 1971. He then served two years with the Navy Reserve while living in Norfolk.

He married Patricia Book on April 25, 1969, at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Norfolk. The couple lived in Norfolk. After serving in the U.S. Navy, he worked at Gillette Dairy in Norfolk for two years.

He then drove truck for different companies throughout his truck driving career including Abler Transfer, Roadway Express, Deitloff Transfer, Darling Rendering, Nebraska Byproducts and Agronomy. He retired from trucking in January of 2014.

He enjoyed collecting Diecast cars and trucks, VHS tapes, '57 Chevys,

baseball and football cards, watching Nebraska and Minnesota football, watching western movies, and playing and coaching softball with Wiese Construction for many years.

He was active in the church and enjoyed playing for the church's softball team. David always left everything in God's hands throughout his life.

He attended First Christian Church in Norfolk and also was a member of the Norfolk Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Survivors include a spouse, Pat Domina of Norfolk; a daughter, Dawn and spouse Monte Bundy, and grandchildren Riggins, Mason and Maddox of Watertown S.D.; a son, Andrew and spouse Beth Domina and grandchildren Hunter and Bella of Elkhorn; David's mother, Lois Domina of Hancock, Iowa; a brother, Paul and spouse Karen Domina of Omaha; a sister, Betty Davis of Omaha; a brother, Gary and spouse Elaina Domina of Coos Bay, Ore.; and numerous aunts, uncles and cousins.

He was preceded in death by his father, Clifton Domina and a sister, Nancy.

Music will be provided by organist Bill Miller, and soloist Romona Noble.

Casket bearers will be PJ Book, Lacey Book, Joe Book, Bob Book, Tom Sparr, Terry Sparr, Tina Bauer and Tim Wiese. 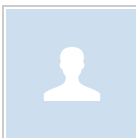
