NORFOLK — Memorial services for Douglas J. Cannon, 73, Norfolk, will be at 10:30 a.m. Friday at Christ is King Community Church in Norfolk. The Rev. Glen Wapelhorst will officiate. Graveside services will follow at Prospect Hill Cemetery. Visitation will be 5-7 p.m. Thursday at Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Norfolk.

Doug was called home on Sunday, Sept. 27, 2015, at Faith Regional Health Services in Norfolk.

Born Jan. 19, 1942, in Norfolk, Doug was the son of John and Lula (Degner) Cannon. He attended grade school in Norfolk and Christ Lutheran School in Norfolk.

Doug worked for Arrow Stage Lines, working on the buses, for Western Roofing and Guaranteed Roofing. He also mowed lawns and shoveled snow. Doug enjoyed attending the sports events for Norfolk High Schools, watching the Nebraska Cornhuskers and reading the Norfolk Daily News. He especially loved his animals and trains.

He was a member of Christ Is King Community Church in Norfolk, where he served as church usher.

Survivors are his sisters, Jeannine and George Stoffer of Green Bay, Wis., Barbara and Don Dvorak of Potter, Janet Wallace of Berthoud, Colo., and Colleen and Lee Olson of Fremont, as well as numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

He was preceded in death by his parents, John and Lula; a brother, Bob; a

nephew, Jeff Olson; and a brother-in-law, Sam Wallace.
