



## Edward C. Boubin

October 27, 1929 - March 19, 2015

NORFOLK — Services for Edward Boubin, 85, Norfolk, will be 10:30 a.m. Monday at Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Norfolk. The Rev. Terry Buol will officiate. Burial will be in Hillcrest Memorial Park Cemetery, Norfolk. Military rites will be by American Legion Post 16, VFW Post 1644 and U.S. Marines Honors Guard. He died Thursday, March 19, 2015, in Madison.

Edward Boubin was born Oct. 27, 1929, in rural Stanton County to Bohumil and Anna (Rosa) Boubin. He attended district rural country schools in Stanton County.

He was a member of American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Eagles Club, all of Norfolk.

Edward farmed in Madison, Stanton and Colfax counties. He retired from farming in 1976.

He worked at Affiliated Foods unloading trucks for numerous years. Edward enjoyed working on small engines.

He served in the U.S. Marines during the Korean War. He enlisted on Oct. 4, 1951, and was discharged on Oct. 3, 1953. He was stationed in Korea.

Survivors include eight siblings, Ruby and husband Francis Bayer of Dodge, Darlene Jaroska of Norfolk, Leona Hake of Creston, Bessie and husband Tom Vavak of Norfolk, Emil and wife Vivian Boubin of Norfolk, Emily Boubin of Norfolk, Mary Korth of Norfolk, Pat and husband Norbert Schmit of Gross City, Pa., and many nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Bohumil and Anna; one sister,

Helen Konerza; one brother, Robert Boubin; and one sister in infancy, Emily.

Music will be by organist Trudy Dannelly. Congregational hymns will be "Amazing Grace," "In The Garden" and "Old Rugged Cross."
