They farmed and ran a dairy there until 1943 when they moved back to Osmond. Elsie worked as an aide at the Osmond General

Hospital.

They moved to Norfolk in 1964 where she then worked at the Lutheran Hospital. She took care of her husband after an illness and her mother. She always welcomed family to stay with her while they were going to college or just needing a place to stay while getting on their feet.

In 1996, she moved back to Osmond to the Maple Hill Apartments. She loved it there with the ladies putting puzzles together and spending time with Emma.

She enjoyed going places and having visitors. She loved to see nieces, nephews and grandchildren to stop in to say hi. She was an avid bowler and won many trophies. Elsie enjoyed gardening and sewing. She had been a resident of Golden Living Center at Wausa since February 2011.

She was a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church.

Survivors are two daughters, Darlean Moore of Ames, Iowa, and Doyle and husband Ralph Timmerman of Osmond, and 12 grandchildren, 24 great-grandchildren and 20 great-great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband Carl in 1973; daughter Ruth Wegner and three sons-in-laws Al Moore, Elden Hand and Don Wegner; and two grandsons, David Nelson and James Reding.
