



## Harlan E. Weigel

August 11, 1923 - December 30, 2017

NORFOLK -- Services for Harlan E. Weigel, 94, of Norfolk. Funeral services will be 10:00 a.m., Saturday at Grace Lutheran Church, Norfolk, interment will be at Zion East Lutheran Cemetery rural Hoskins, Visitation will be 4:00 to 7:00 p.m., Friday at Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Norfolk. Officiating will be Reverend Chris Asbury and Reverend Ray Wilke.

Military rites will be conducted by the American Legion Post 16, VFW Post 1644, both of Norfolk, and the U.S. Army Honors Guard. Harlan died Saturday, December 30, 2017 at the Heritage of Bel-Air Nursing Home in Norfolk. Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Norfolk is in charge of the arrangements. Born Aug. 11, 1923, in rural Pierce County, he was the son of Hugo and Anna (Miller) Weigel. He attended rural Cedar County schools and later in life he received his GED.

After high school, Harlan returned to Nebraska in February 1943 and entered the U.S. Army.

He married Pearl Jugel on June 25, 1944, at Grace Lutheran Church in Wayne. The couple lived in Wayne.

In late 1944, Harlan was sent to Belgium, Germany, and he served in George S. Patton's 3rd Army, 80th Division, 317 Regiment, H Company during the Battle of the Bulge. He was then on to Luxembourg and Germany. Harlan returned to the U.S. in December 1945 and was honorably discharged Dec. 23, 1945.

Harlan and Pearl lived in Dixon County for three years, farming for a short

time before moving to California in 1951.

Harlan worked at Norton Air Force Base in San Bernardino, Calif., for 14 years. They then moved to Ogden, Utah, and he worked nine years at Hill Air Force Base.

Harlan worked as a civilian at the Air Force bases during the Korean and Vietnam wars. Harlan retired in June of 1974. The couple then moved to Nebraska to Holt and Cedar counties. They moved to Norfolk in 1977.

Harlan worked as guard at Wells Fargo. He enjoyed farming and raising animals, yard work and loved his family.

Pearl died in July 2008. Harlan had been a resident of Heritage of Bel-Air since June 2017.

Harlan was a member of Grace Lutheran Church in Norfolk, a life member of American Legion Post 16 and VFW Post 1644, both of Norfolk.

Survivors include his sons, Donald Weigel of Highland, Calif., and Michael (Tammy) Weigel of Norfolk; a daughter, Ahna Roesch of Sioux City; 11 grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren; and a brother, Rudy Weigel of Great Falls, Mont.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Hugo and Anna; his spouse, Pearl; a sister, Frieda; two granddaughters; and a daughter.
