Helen and Elmer were married at United Methodist Church in Pierce on August 4, 1935. Helen was a homemaker, but together they owned and operated the first dry cleaner in Pierce for nine years. They did some farming west of Pierce and worked at Reeds Furniture store in Pierce. Helen and Elmer went to nursing homes throughout the area and entertained the elderly. She has been a resident of the Pierce Manor since October of 2007. Helen is survived by two sons Stanley and wife Dorothy Weyhrich of Kingston, Arkansas, Jerry and wife LaFaye Weyhrich of Chickasha, Oklahoma, seven grandchildren, 25 great grandchildren, four step great grandchildren, five great-great grandchildren, one sister Jane Kimball of Norfolk, NE; one brother Harlan and wife LaVerna Zumbrum of Norfolk, NE.
