NORFOLK -- Memorial service for Ida "Edie" Weich, 94, of Norfolk will be held at 10:30 a.m., Saturday, April 22, 2023 at the Christ Lutheran Church in Norfolk. Edie passed away on Monday, January 16, 2023 at the Heritage of Bel Air Nursing Home in Norfolk. Stonacek Funeral Chapel in Norfolk is in charge of the arrangements.

Ida "Edie" was born on June 2, 1928 in Salzberg, Austria to Barb and George Herzog. A romance started in September, 1946 in a Army mess hall in Saalfelden where she worked and would later meet DuWayne Weich. DuWayne was discharged from the Army on April 6, 1946 and he returned to Nebraska. Later Edie came to the states after getting the paper work. When she landed she couldn't speak English, but DuWayne knew German. She quickly learned English. DuWayne and Edie were married at Christ Lutheran Church in Norfolk and would make their home in Norfolk. Over the years, Edie worked at the State Hospital and McDonalds Clothing in Norfolk.

In the 1970's, Edie opened a Ceramic Hut Store on South 1st Street and later was employed at the 1st Walmart Store for many years until she retired. She was an avid bowler, member of the American Legion and V.F.W. Auxiliary. Three boys were born to this marriage, LeWayne, Dennis, and Gary Weich.
