



## Jack L. Brockman

Services for Jack L. Brockman, 82, of Norfolk will be at 10:30 a.m. Thursday at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Winside, with burial in Hillcrest Memorial Park Cemetery, Norfolk, and military rites by Roy Reed American Legion Post # 252. The Rev. Timothy Steckling will officiate. Visitation will be 5-8 p.m. Wednesday at the church under direction of Stonacek Funeral Chapel. He died Sunday, Oct. 16, 2011, at the Norfolk Veterans Home. Jack LeRoy Brockman was born Dec. 21, 1928, at Winside to Herman and Nellie (Mowinkel) Brockman. He attended District 62 Grade School in Carroll and graduated from Winside High School in 1946. He married Marilyn Schlueter Aug. 25, 1957, at St. John's Green Garden at rural Madison. They farmed in the Winside area for 51 years. He also worked at the Winside Alfalfa dehydration plant for 10 years. He retired from farming in 2007 and moved to the Norfolk Veterans Home in November of 2008. He served in the Army from March 19, 1951, to Feb. 27, 1953. Jack was a heavy artillery operator in Korea during the war. Church and lodge affiliations include St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Winside, Winside American Legion, member of the Farm Bureau. Survivors include wife Marilyn Brockman of Norfolk; four children, Brad Brockman of Nashville, Tenn., Daniel and wife Shelly Brockman of Winside, Debra and husband Mark Novak of Springfield, Va., and Julie Brockman of Lincoln; three grandchildren; many nieces, nephews and cousins. He was preceded in death by parents and one brother, Charles. Organist will be Darci Frahm with congregational hymns "How Great Thou Art," "A Mighty Fortress"
