Jack was born Jan. 7, 1929, in West Point, Neb., the son of Louie and Anna (Rosendal) Grevson. The family farmed in Stanton County, then moved to Oregon for a short time. They returned to Stanton in 1940, and Jack received his education in rural schools.

Jack farmed for 40 years, owned and operated the old Enola elevator and bred and raised Simmental cattle. He was a board member for several farm organizations and the Stanton Fair Board, where he served for 23 years. He was an avid hunter and sportsman, and he played and coached softball for 30 years. Jack also had a pilot's license and owned an airplane with his brother Willard. He enjoyed University of Nebraska football and training on his recumbent trike for RAGBRAI, a bicycle ride across Iowa.

After Jack retired from farming, he and his wife moved to Norfolk, where he drove a truck for Gerhold Concrete for 18 years.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 65 years, Audrey Grevson, of Norfolk;

four children, Brenda (K.J.) Marshall, of Bixby Okla., Denise (Jim) Petersen, of Texarkana, Texas, Julie (Greg) McElvain, of Parker, Colo., and Tim Grevson, of Jefferson, Iowa; eight grandchildren; 10 great-grandchildren; a sister, Virginia Terry, of Norfolk; and many nieces and nephews.

Jack was preceded in death by his parents; four brothers, Lyle, Willard, Gerald and Myron (Bud); and two sisters, Lorraine and Betty.
