Born Oct. 24, 1934, on the family farm in rural Norfolk, he was the son of Albert and Lucille (Felger) Wegner Sr. He attended grade school in Battle Creek and graduated from Battle Creek High School. After graduating from high school, Jim got a job at Lookers in Norfolk, which is where he met Delores. He married Delores D. Gugat on June 16, 1957, at Mount Olive Lutheran Church in Norfolk. Jim and Delores lived in Norfolk, and he continued to work at Lookers. He later began working as a mechanic for Firestone Complete Auto Care in Norfolk, where he worked until his retirement. Jim enjoyed polka music, playing his accordion and was an amateur radio operator. He enjoyed traveling with his spouse and golfing. A memorable moment for Jim was when he hit a hole in one while golfing at Fair Play Golf Course in Norfolk.

Survivors include a brother, Albert Wegner Jr. of Omaha, along with nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his spouse, Delores, who died Oct. 14, 2018; his parents, Albert Sr. and Lucille; his sisters, Jeanette Johnson and Carolyn Mandel; and a brother, Robert during infancy.
