NORFOLK -- Janaree Ediger Nore, 60, passed away at Faith Regional Health Services in Norfolk, NE on Monday, January 11, 2016 after falling into a coma one week prior following a routine surgery. For sixty years she enjoyed making art, teaching children, writing poetry and fiction, and meaningful conversations.

Born on September 7, 1955 to Betty June and Clifford James Ediger, Janaree grew up in Aurora, NE with her sister Marlene and brother Mark. As a girl and a teen she loved being in girl scouts, baking in 4H, taking art lessons, attending Methodist summer camp, skiing and photography. She played clarinet in the high school marching band and then switched to the drum section to play the cymbals; she marched five miles in the Miami Orange Bowl parade twirling the cymbals over her head.

She graduated from Aurora High School in 1973 and went to Nebraska Wesleyan University, where she met many of her closest friends, and where she had the best conversations of her life at Village Inn after 11:00 at night. She transferred to Illinois State University, where she earned a Bachelor's in Education cum laude with a concentration in Early Childhood Education.

After teaching briefly in Harvard, NE, in 1979 she opened Good Beginnings, a preschool in Aurora, NE. Later that year she traveled to Europe with her parents, and danced until dawn seeking nightlife in Munich, Germany.

In 1981, she married Mark Nore and moved to Kansas City, MO and had her son, Myer in 1982, followed by her daughter Kathryn in 1986. She transitioned to single parenthood by moving to Hampton, NE in 1988. After working for the University of Nebraska in the education department training teachers around Nebraska, in 1993 she moved to Lincoln, NE to send her children to the best school she could relocate to in the state.

Janaree lived in Lincoln for twenty years, working as a mentor and then a teacher for Lincoln Public Schools for the better part of her time in Lincoln. She co-taught the Montessori K-2 program with her colleague and close friend Mona Thompson at Everett Elementary for ten years, where she helped hundreds of children. In 2013, Janaree moved in with her mother Betty June in Norfolk, NE after her father Cliff passed away, where she remained, developing a close relationship with children, neighbors and friends in the community.

She is survived by her mother, Betty June Ediger, her son, Myer Nore and his wife Arhia Kohlmoos of Boston, MA, her daughter Kathryn Nore and fiancée Todd Aken of Lincoln, NE. Her favorite obsessions (in order of importance starting with #1) were Diet Coke, Chocolate, coffee with cream, writing, reading, photography, browsing Flickr, making art, visiting art, and having conversations with people about things that matter.
