She went to Holy Trinity Catholic Grade School and graduated from Holy Trinity Catholic High School in 1953 at Hartington. She attended Wayne State College. She was married to Donald Dendinger Sept. 29, 1955, at Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Hartington. After JoAnne and Donald were married, they lived in Hartington until moving to California in 1958 to the bay area. JoAnne worked as the ward clerk at Mt. Diablo Hospital for 17 years. In June of 1980, they moved to Hartington and owned and managed Skylon Ball Room in Hartington. In 1992, JoAnne and Donald moved to Norfolk. She worked for the Norfolk Senior Center for 10 years and retired from there in 2008. JoAnne's hobbies included dancing, sewing, camping, knitting and crocheting and doing crossword puzzles. She had been a resident of Norfolk Veterans Home since February. JoAnne passed away peacefully with family by her side on Sunday, Sept. 29, 2013, after courageously fighting cancer for the past three years.
