NORFOLK – Memorial service for Kenneth A. "Ken" Redler Sr., 65, of Norfolk, will be held at 11:00 a.m. Saturday, March 1, 2025 at the Victory Road Assembly Of God Church in Norfolk. Ken was born on September 29, 1959 in Norfolk, Nebraska to Theodore and Viola (Scholl) Redler Jr. He grew up in Petersburg and attended grade school at St. John's Catholic School in Petersburg and graduated from Elgin Pope John High School. He was a member of Victory Road Assembly Of God Church, Royal Rangers, Norfolk Archery Club and was a Hunter Safety Instructor. Ken enjoyed fishing, hunting, and spending time with his grandkids and family.
