Bob was born in Norfolk, NE on December 6, 1945, the son of Elmer and Margaret (Alberta) Thenhaus. He graduated from Norfolk High School and continued on to Wayne State College, where he received a Bachelor’s degree in Business. For the majority of his career, Bob worked in several western states (including Colorado, Nevada, Wyoming, and Montana) managing contracts for large hydroelectric projects. Bob retired early to take care of his mother after his father passed away.

Bob was an avid traveler and was proud to say that he had visited all seven continents including Antarctica. Throughout his life, he enjoyed billiards, cribbage, and weightlifting. He was an avid reader of all types of books including the King James Bible. He loved Upwards and Scrabble and often had multiple Words with Friends games going at the same time. Bob was active in his church and had a strong faith in God. Many describe him as

being kind and cheerful.

In spite of all his adventures, Bob did not take on marriage until he reunited with Sharolyn (Bargstadt) Clark at their 40th high school reunion. At 59, he was married for the first time to the love of his life. They had five wonderful years together with memorable trips, shared faith, and daily Upwards competitions. Sadly, Bob lost Sharolyn unexpectedly the day before their fifth anniversary.

After a few lonely years in Des Moines, IA, without Sharolyn, Bob spent the last years of his life in Jasper, IN with his stepdaughter, Heidi, and her family enjoying Friday night movies and pizza. He also loved Klondike bars and Reece's Peanut Butter cups and he never passed a Dairy Queen without getting an Oreo Blizzard.

Bob is survived by his two stepdaughters Rebekah Santiago, husband Rafael Santiago, and Heidi Ehrhard, husband Bob Ehrhard, and grandchildren Amanda Ehrhard and Eric Ehrhard.
